Welcome to the recently revived KFG newsletter and a BIG THANK YOU to Mary for stepping up to get this essential project off the ground.

I would highly encourage the directors of the various shooting, fishing and archery disciplines to take the time and get some news of what's going on in their particular sport in to Mary.

Let me start by explaining on how to address your gripes, concerns, input, or compliments to the movers and shakers of KFG (Club Officials and Trustees). By unanimous trustee vote of early 2020, this is the process.

First get your thoughts together (on paper if necessary), then contact at Kim LaFlair (luvqhrses@nycap.rr.com) or me at 518-587-3327 to make an appointment to appear at the next Trustee Meeting (we meet every first Monday of the month, 7 PM). You are then put on a speakers' list and afforded 5-7 minutes to expound on your topic without interruption or input from anyone. You will then be allowed to leave or sit without further comment. If your comments require immediate Trustee action, a closed Executive Session meeting will be held and a decision will be rendered. If your input is of a routine nature, then the Trustees and KFG officials will review the feasibility, cost, etc., and get back to you at a later date. As I was the prime author of this change to our meeting format, I looked at the plan implementation from a member's view. Please do not be intimidated by this process. You have as much right as any club Director or Trustee to determine KFG's future direction.

Let's discuss another big step towards getting our finances up to current industry standards. We found the computer the club purchased a couple years ago needed a couple software updates. QuickBooks 2020 was purchased as advised by our CPA on retainer. Then began the hard work. Our 2019 financials were downloaded for comparison to 2020. Every income/expense was then determined and assigned a category number. While all this was happening, our Treasurer, Cathy Miller and me were trained how to use QuickBooks 2020. Now at every Trustee or Regular Meeting (when we are allowed to conduct them) will have up to the minute dollar balances.

So how are we doing in this day of COVID-19? Our Chief Range Safety Officer Kevin Harkins is our point man in advising KFG of the rules and regulations from the various county and state agencies. As of this date, KFG is allowed a maximum of 50 people on our property at any one time. That is why the pistol, rifle and shotgun ranges are closed when activities such as Cowboy Action Shooting or Action Pistol are scheduled. Even though we built our pistol and rifle ranges to be used independently of other activities, COVID-19 rules take precedence. 50 folks max – no exceptions. Before you pack your car up with gear and guns, check the website. If you see an activity on a weekend and it says, "ALL RANGES CLOSED," blame it on COVID-19.

Early September the eagerly awaited Five Stand Shotgun Range was completed enough to start a regular three day-a-week schedule. For those not familiar with this shotgun discipline, it is a mix of trap, skeet and sporting clays. The rounds go fairly quickly - 25 minutes or so with no scoring kept except for those who care about such things. The clay pigeons (25 per round for each shooter) are thrown from various traps in different directions. Feel you are a good trap or skeet shooter???? Prepared to be humbled!!!! But while you are shooting and missing, you will hear a LOT of laughing and good-natured bantering. And this enjoyment will be a year round discipline. Covered shooting stations. Rain, sleet or snow- we shoot.

For those who wish to shoot skeet, no problem. We structured the days shooting schedule with Skeet starting at 9 AM. Conduct your 2-3 rounds and at 10 AM or so, Five Stand Shotgun will commence. For the month of October and November, our Skeet/Five Stand Shotgun is scheduled for every Wednesday,

2020 has been a “Challenging” year, and a busy one. I would like to start off by thanking all the members who volunteer their time and energy to help keep the range safe and well maintained. Maintained? Yes, maintained by volunteers who build and maintain the overshoot boxes, safety updates as required/suggested, and suggestions that keep coming in on different ways to make our club safe and your experience enjoyable.

The COVID-19 crisis caused additional stress to one and all. Working with the Sheriff’s office and the County Dept. of Health, we were able to re-open prior to the State’s guidelines, even though we were limited to the number of people on the property. By July, we were allowed to re-open all ranges, with a max number of 50 people on the property at a time, and resume classes. While meetings in the clubhouse are limited to 40 people which impacted our meetings such as Trustee and Membership, we are functional.

These limitations caused us to re-think how to add new members to the club. With the help of another group of RSOs, we have updated the “New Member Orientation” sessions. These sessions were started over a year ago to address the number of people who wanted to join a club that cared about their safety and that of its members. The New Member Orientation (NMO) is a two-hour review of basic safety protocols developed by the NRA and a one-hour tour of the property and the ranges. (By the way, if you would like to use the 200 Yard Range, this orientation session is the first step in a two-step process. Complete this and then demonstrate your safety and skills!)

The role of the club RSO continues to expand. When an outside group wants to use our ranges, after having received approval from the Trustees, this group has to have a club RSO attend their “session.” RSOs are there to

ensure the club’s safety protocols are followed. As a reference, for every eight (8) “students” or “guests,” the club requires one club RSO.

This support goes toward the RSO accumulating the thirty (30) hours of service necessary to receive a discount on their membership renewal.

Two final points that I am happy to report on: We have a volunteer back in charge of the Gallery Fun Shoot. Angie Scriptor, club RSO (and NRA certified Chief Range Safety Officer) has stepped up, developed a program, provided me with the required safety protocols and has run more than a couple great sessions. Opened to members and non-members alike, second and fourth Mondays, starting at 5 PM. Check the club website for details.

I have received a number of requests to re-start the 200 Yard Qualifications. I have spoken to a team member who will be starting the qualification process up again soon. Watch for updates!

At 72 years old, the club is doing well and that is the result of volunteers and members all working to have fun and keep everyone one safe. Please do your part to keep this great streak going. If you see something that concerns you, please reach out to an RSO and let us know what’s on your mind. We need everyone’s help to continue to make this a GREAT Club!

Unlike online offerings, our in-class approach gives you access to our knowledgeable, certified instructors to answer any questions you may have, and may gain some insight to questions others may bring up during discussion.

Unrestricted Pistol Classes

Kayaderosseras Fish and Game Club is authorized by the Saratoga County Sheriff's Office to conduct an approved course to allow the applicant to apply for an amendment to remove pistol license restrictions (hunting and target). This amendment is at the complete discretion of the judge.

The applicant must have held their pistol license for a minimum of one year to attend this course. This course consists of both classroom instruction with a written exam, and a live fire qualification. If both are passed, a completion certificate is given. Applicants then submit this certificate along with their amendment form to the Sheriff's office.


The Saratoga County pistol courses were suspended by the Sheriff in March of this year due to the Covid-19 pandemic. This included the Advanced (Unrestricted) course. In July, the suspension was lifted, and our first course was conducted on July 25th. This and subsequent courses have been well attended, with the October 31 course completely full. The November and December courses still have openings as of now.

MONTHLY COWBOY ACTION & ROUGH RIDER SHOOTS



Well, 2020 has certainly not turned out to be the year we had hoped for in so many ways, with shooting sports at KF&G being seriously affected by the novel coronavirus. First, the Circle K Regulators (CKR) were forced to cancel the popular Cabin Fever Shoot/Cowboy Swap'n'Sell/Pot Luck dinner in late March, and then our first three regularly scheduled monthly Cowboy Action (CAS) and Rough Rider (RR) shoots in April – June due to the COVID-19 lockdown. We also made the tough decision to cancel what was to have been our big 20th Anniversary SASS New York State Cowboy Action Shooting Championship, Heluva Rukus, in mid-Sept., and to postpone our SASS New York State Wild Bunch Action Shooting Championship, Muster at Ft. Misery, from mid-May to mid-October, again due to COVID-19 restrictions.

Thankfully, we have been able to host our regular monthly matches since July, always making sure to keep our numbers below the 50 max allowed on site and adhere to social distancing/mask wearing requirements. Although the number of shooters has been down somewhat even for our recent monthly events, those who have chosen to participate have enjoyed the opportunity to get outside and finally have a chance to throw some lead with their shooting pards. Unfortunately, the CAS/RR season is winding down now with just a couple of monthly shoots left, but we are keeping our fingers crossed that things will change next year, and that 2021 will be a banner year for us at the Circle K.

A special thanks goes out to Keith Feldman (stage writer for the CAS matches), Ted Kunath (stage writer for the RR matches), Diane Schena (match director/stage writer for the SASS NYS Wild Bunch Championship), and to all those who have helped with setup, teardown, and prop building and repair throughout the year. We are so lucky to have such a hard-working group dedicated to providing folks with the opportunity to shoot fun-filled CAS/RR/WB matches at our premiere facility.

Muster @ Ft. Misery 2020, the NYS Wild Bunch Championship, was postponed from May until October 10-11, 2020, due to COVID, and for once we had two days of awesome weather! Who would have thought we would get better weather in October than May, but that's the kind of year it has been! We were limited to only 50 people on the property, in its entirety, so we had to limit the number of shooters in order to accommodate the people working the event - the Milton Fire Dept., the Boy Scouts and the food vendor. Last year we had 60+ shooters, but this year due to the limitations and a couple of last minute cancellations, we only had 39 competitors. For those of you not familiar with Wild Bunch, it is a timed event where shooters dressed in period correct clothing shoot steel targets in different patterns/scenarios using a 1911 pistol, a model 12 or 97 pump shotgun and a lever action rifle. So you could say it is the Original 3 Gun competition!! Oh, and competitors assume an "alias" that they shoot under as part of the "game!" A big congratulations to our overall and NYS Champions in the following categories: Mens Modern – Slim Chance Chris, Mens Modern Senior – Patchogue Mike, Ladies Modern – Renegade Roper, Mens Traditional – Montague Kid and Mens Traditional Senior – Dutch Cassidy. Overall/NYS Top Man was Montague Kid and Overall/NYS Top Lady was Renegade Roper. I am still waiting to give out the coveted white 1911 clean shoot pin, but alas, not this year! Our two closest competitors that received the "close enough" horseshoe and hand grenade pin were Kester Road Kid with only 8 misses, and Patchogue Mike with 11 misses. We also had

10 veterans who shot the match. Thank you for your service, guys and gals!

The donations we received for the gun tickets enabled us to donate \$1000 to the Milton Fire Dept., with the other half going to the Club. Our lucky winner was drawn at the awards ceremony. Congrats, Dude!

We were also proud to be able to support our local Boy Scout troop once again. The Scouts earn money by picking brass and selling their baked goods at the event. This year, even with our restricted number of shooters and the public not being allowed to attend, they still made \$791 at the event! This was one of the only fund raisers they have been able to hold all year, so we were proud to be a big part of it. They use the money for some of the boys to go to their annual camp event. Last year they made \$853, and there were 60+ shooters plus the public, so thanks to all the shooters that supported them this year. I know I personally went above and beyond supporting their bake sale! Hey, we've all put on the COVID-15, so what's a few pounds more??? Besides, those desserts were worth it!

Our food vendor was Fire and Smoke BBQ (518-265-6797). They had awesome breakfast sandwiches and pulled pork lunches at very reasonable prices. Not to mention, it is a local business run by two members of the Galway Fire Dept. We are very proud to support our local first responders (both Milton and Galway) in any way that we can!

Next year, we plan on holding Muster @ Ft. Misery on May 15-16, 2021, so mark your calendars! Hope to see you there, even if it's just to watch and support our food vendor and Boy Scouts baked goods

KF&G ACTION PISTOL

Like the other shooting sports at KF&G, our Action Pistol (AP) matches were put on hold April – June due to the pandemic. But once the range was finally re-opened for competitions in July, the monthly Action Pistol shoots were quickly off and running – literally! With participants not only from KF&G but from other clubs (primarily SaraSpa) and shooting disciplines (mainly CAS/WB, IDPA and USPSA), the sport has gotten very popular this season, coming very close to the allowed 50 person max the last couple of months. With only a centerfire handgun, a holster, and a handful of magazines needed to get into the sport, start-up is far less costly than some other shooting sports. That fact and the fact that our rules are less complex and demanding than those for other similar “run and gun” competitive shooting sports makes KF&G AP attractive to those of all ages and levels of expertise (always with safety in mind, of course!). At this time, the AP season is winding down with only two more shoots left

in 2020. However, we hope to be able to go back to a full schedule of monthly matches April – October 2021, including a 2-day event next July.

Angie Scripter and Clarence Hale have created new and interesting games and targets – some competitive, and some just for plinking. They may include silhouettes, bowling pins, clays, balloons, and other reactive targets and games designed to be fun and challenging for all skill levels.

Stages are available for rimfire and center-fire revolvers and semi-autos of all calibers.

Basic rules and guidelines
Handguns only - revolvers and semi-automatic pistols,



45 calibers or less.

Rimfire - lead and plated bullets are permitted

- **Centerfire** - LEAD BULLETS ONLY
- No jacketed ammo allowed for any caliber. Shooters can load no more than 10 rounds in their magazines.
- Loading can only be done in the safe area or on the firing line.
- Shooters will remain outside the fenced area with unloaded handguns cased or holstered until called to the staging (on-deck) area by the Range Officer. All handguns will remain in cases or holsters or carried to the shooting position unloaded, with slides back; cylinders or loading gates open. Magazines may be loaded in the staging area.

Cost: \$5 for an evening of fun.
Bring your own ammo. (see above)
We supply the targets.

Guests are always welcome! Open to the public!

All shoots are weather permitting, and shooting starts at 5:00 pm.
(We can accommodate anyone arriving as late as 6:00 pm)



This has been a rough year! One way or another, this pandemic has forced us to make decisions that could affect the health of people we come in contact with. For this reason, our Archery shoots were cancelled, but hopefully we will be able to resume them in 2021.



Even though we shut down, it does not mean we quit improving. Just the opposite occurred! We took advantage of this difficult situation and dedicated our efforts to making things better.

We got a lucky break!!! One of our sister clubs (The Guan Ho Ha) gave us a bunch of used 3D targets that needed repairs. With time on our hands, we cleaned, replaced broken parts, and gave them several coats of paint. The finished products turned out great. If we had to buy these 3D targets, it would have cost us \$3,500. We now have a surplus!
